

Find Journal Articles

- **Step 1**

A. To find articles on a topic use the electronic [article databases](#) or look in a [print index](#) (for example: *EBSCOhost*, *InfoTrac*, *PsycINFO*, *Art Index*, etc.). The databases can be found on the site of [Online Databases](#) on the Marywood Library webpage. Most of these databases will guide you to pertinent articles, and many will even provide you with the full-text of an article.

B. To find articles published in a specific journal, search the [Journal Locator](#) first to determine if Marywood Library provides access to the full-text of the journal, and to identify the online database that offers access to the full-text journal online.

- **Step 2**

If the full text of the article is not online, you need to locate the periodical that the article is in. Check the Marywood University library's online catalog, [Our Catalog](#), to see if our library owns the journal title and issue you are looking for. For best results you may perform a *Periodical Title* search.

- **Step 3**

The print journals are located on the 1st floor of the LRC Building. Please consult Serials staff if you have trouble locating an item or using a reader-printer machine.

- **Step 4**

You may [Order from Other Libraries](#), if we do not subscribe to the periodical you need.
