Exploring Current Drug Trends will investigate contemporary patterns of substance abuse. It will identify specific substances of abuse, earlier drugs that have emerged in new and unique ways and novel modes of administration. This didactic seminar includes case studies, a comprehensive Power Point presentation, numerous handouts, video segments and encouraged audience interaction. The audience includes, but is not limited to, students, nurses, social workers, drug and alcohol counselors, resident advisors, educators, guidance counselors and concerned citizens.
