Student Planning

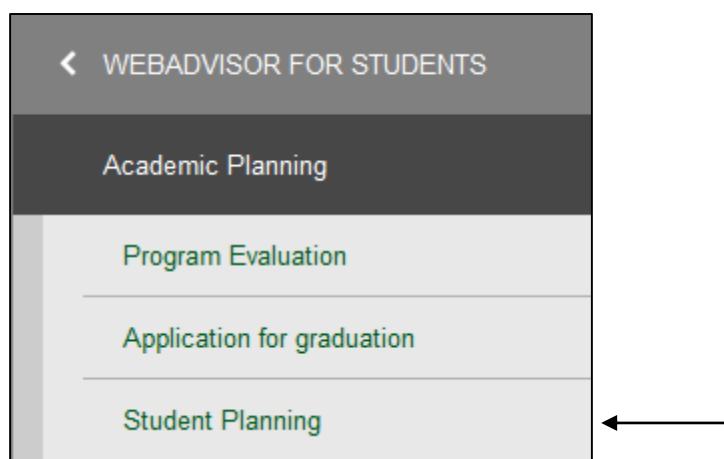
Overview

Marywood students can now plan out their course of study from freshman through senior year as well as while attaining their graduate degrees. While working with their academic advisors, students can plan what classes to take during specific semesters so that they are able to complete their degree in a timely manner. Besides planning out their course load, students may also track their progress and schedule their classes through the student planning tool.

Log On to the MarywoodYOU Portal

1. Open a Web browser (Internet Explorer is recommended) and navigate to <http://www.marywood.edu> .
2. Click on the **MarywoodYou** link at the bottom of the Marywood home page.
3. Type your *User name* and *Password* in the dialog box. Then, click **Log On**.

4. The MarywoodYOU Portal page displays.
5. Locate the **Self-Service Menu**.
6. Select **WebAdvisor for Students**.
7. Expand **Academic Planning**, then select **Student Planning**. That page will open in a new browser tab.



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Home

- The **Home** section under the *Student Planning* tab provides you with the option to **View Your Progress** (Step 1) or **Plan Your Degree & Register for Classes** (Step 2). It also provides you with a calendar view of your current schedule.

- The class is added to the Course Plan, Timeline, and Progress tabs.

Plan & Schedule

- The **Plan & Schedule** section allows you to see your current, future or past schedules, view a timeline of the semester you have attended or plan to attend, and view or add notes that you and your academic advisor can add to your academic plan.
- On the **Schedule** tab, you can use the left and right arrows to move back and forth through semesters. You may also utilize the **Print** button underneath the semester title to print out the displayed schedule. The **Schedule** tab also allows you to filter sections and add your courses to iCal. You may also click the **Drop** button on the left hand side to drop a future course that you have scheduled. If you select to drop a registered course, it will prompt you to verify that you wish to drop the course. If this is correct, click the **Update** and your schedule will be modified.

- To schedule a planned course that shows up in the course listings for an upcoming semester, click on **View Other Sections** to see the sections that are being offered for this course. Once you find the section that you would like to take, click on that section to display

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the section details. If this is the correct course that you would like to register for, click **Add section to schedule**. When it is added to your schedule and displayed in yellow, click the  button to officially register for the course. You will notice that it turns green which represents a scheduled course.

- The **Timeline** tab displays a list of courses by semester. You can navigate to past or future semesters by clicking on the left or right arrows. Grades and GPA information for completed courses/semesters can be quickly viewed in the Timeline.


