Things to do now, so you can be ready for move-in day (Saturday, August 24)

- Once you receive your Marywood University e-mail address, you will need to complete the [2019-2020 Housing & Dining Agreement and Preference Form](#).
- Take steps to comply with Pennsylvania state law, signed on June 28, 2002, that requires vaccinations against meningococcal meningitis for students living in University Housing. **ALL residents at Marywood must be vaccinated before moving into University Housing for the Fall 2019 Semester.** Students choosing to be exempted from the law must sign a waiver form stating that s/he reviewed the information and has chosen not to be vaccinated against the disease for religious or other reasons.
- Complete the Health History and Immunization Record, which is required for students to receive care from the Student Health Services Office. A copy of the form can be found at www.marywood.edu/healthservices/forms/

When packing for campus, we suggest you consider bringing...

(but remember you are sharing a space so everything you want to bring may not fit, but everything you truly need will fit)

- Bath and bed linens (Can be purchased from Residence Hall Linens at: <http://www.ocm.com/myr>) – students find that twin XL sheets work best
- Mattress pad/cover/egg crate
- Pillows
- Power strips – must have a circuit breaker/reset button (extension cords not permitted)
- USB cord for printer
- Alarm clock
- Desk lamp (**may not have a halogen light bulb**)
- Shower curtain and rings
- Cleaning supplies
- Stapler, paper clips, etc.
- Small dry erase board for room door
- A file to store important University documents
- Computer and printer (labs are available)
- TV and cable cord
- Microfridge from My Microfridge (www.mymicrofridge.com/) or Energy Star rated small fridge – 10.0 amps or less (optional)

For your safety and for those around you, these items are not permitted:

- Free standing microwaves
- Extension cords and multi-plug adapters (must be a power strip with circuit breaker/reset button)
- Candles, incense
- Pets other than fish – must be in a 10 gallon tank or smaller
- Air conditioners
- Space heaters
- Wireless Routers
- Crock pots and rice cookers
- Toasters, toaster ovens, or similar cooking items with exposed heating coils
- Hot plates, electric skillets or grills and similar cooking devices
- Halogen lamps or multi-bulb lamps
- Nails, tacks or tape that damage walls
- Items hung from or attached to the ceiling
- Alcohol or alcohol-associated paraphernalia (includes any glasses or containers used for alcohol)
- Hoverboards, Swagways, or similar devices
- String lights (battery-operated or plug-in), including holiday lights
