| 3 credits Intro to Psych or Soc or Poli Sci | Category 5: Social Science (for 42-credit core programs). For 40-credit programs, these credits transfer in as PSYC/SOC/CJ and is credited towards whatever is needed for the 120 credits required for graduation. | Yes |
| 3 credits Speech | Category 2: Oral Communication Course | Yes |

*If a student is bringing (6) credits of English AND (6) credits of History, credit will be applied to: Category 5: Elective and a 100-level Elective in either discipline. For example, (6) credits of English and (6) of History would count for: ENGL 160 (3), Category 3: History (3), Category 5: Elective (3), and one 100-level English OR History course (3), totaling (12) credits of requirements.

For current Marywood students seeking to take a course elsewhere, the Category 3: English Literature must be a 300-level course or above.
